Boys State and Girls State DO Make A Difference!


I attended Florida Boys State in 2021 as a delegate from Winter Park Post 112 and had my bill unanimously passed in the mock House and Senate. After 3 years of working with legislators, the bill was signed into Florida law this summer.

The purpose of my bill is to introduce a Cure Diabetes specialty license plate, with all of the money going strictly to cure research for Type 1 diabetes. The money goes to the Diabetes Research Institute (at the Miller School of Medicine at the University of Miami), the University of Florida Diabetes Institute, and Breakthrough T1D (formerly JDRF).

Now, we need 3,000 presale vouchers for the license plate to go into production. They can easily be purchased online for \$33 by anyone with a vehicle titled in their name in Florida. I attached an image of the plate below and a FAQ document containing the link to purchase vouchers (https://county-taxes.net/fl-escambia/vouchers).

As a Boys State alum, I would greatly appreciate any help getting this information distributed to as many people as possible. Thank you for giving me the confidence to make a difference with this legislation.


And congratulations to our Unit for overachieving our membership goal. As of October 20th, we have 31 members for 2025, bringing us to 107%.

American Legion Post 347 in Lady Lake kicked off its fall season with an Oktoberfest event Sunday, September 29. The dinner dance included German food made by Auxiliary members as well as dancing, games and prizes.

Getting together and sharing an authentic German meal is what Maureen Caswell and Barbara Kyle enjoy each year as they plan the Oktoberfest Dinner Dance at American Legion Post 347 in Lady Lake.

On Sunday, American Legion Post 347's Auxiliary Unit kicked off its fall season of events with the annual Oktoberfest Dinner Dance event.

"It's to celebrate fall," said Caswell auxiliary president. "A lot of our members are back home in Florida, so it's a fall celebration, and we love the food."

The auxiliary is a sub-group of the American Legion that runs volunteer programs throughout the year. Membership is open to relatives of those who served in the U.S. military. American Legion Post 347 is the largest American Legion Post in the world with more than 6,000 members.

The post was chartered December 9, 1987, and its post facility was dedicated July 4, 1997. The American Legion is open from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday. The auxiliary meets at 6 p.m. the first Wednesday of every month at Post 347, located at 699 W. Lady Lake Blvd. in Lady Lake.

During the event, there is dinner and dancing. It also raises money for various charities the auxiliary supports.

Jonnell & The G Man provided entertainment for the dinner dance. There also were trivia games, door prizes and chance drawings.

This year's menu included bratwurst, j!ägerschnitzel, German potato salad, red cabbage, späetzle, cucumber salad, applesauce and rye/pumpernickel bread, all prepared by members of the auxiliary.

they can get in the area without traveling too far out of The Villages, Caswell said.

This also is the most successful event the auxiliary has had since it started in 2011, said Kyle, auxiliary secretary and general Post 347 member.

This year the auxiliary sold 173 tickets at \$25 each to raise more than \$4000. A portion of the money raised will support organizations related to veterans, children and scholarships. The group will choose where to donate it specifically at a later date, Caswell said.

Supporting various local charities is what the auxiliary is all about, the event co-chairs said.

The event also is about getting together for a good time at the post, said Kyle, of the Village of Mira Mesa.

"I enjoy seeing all the people come and having a good time," said Kyle, a U.S. Marine Corps veteran. "I like the camaraderie of our club."

The group's next big event is the kickoff of its holiday food drive, which runs from October to December to feed families for Thanksgiving and Christmas.

For more than 20 years, Post 347 has worked to help people during the holiday season.

It's all about providing food for people in need in the community, said Caswell, of the Village of Pinellas.

The group will collect food throughout the holiday season, and members of Post 347 will pack meal boxes to give to families.


