Our little Unit was quite busy in November and December will be busy for us, too. We received a picture of our adopted Eastbrook class proudly holding up their first books received from Scholastic Books because of our donation to their teacher for Give Ten to Education.



In early November, Marge, Debi, and Nell shopped for our Eastbrook Elementary food pantry's Backpack Project. The school provides backpacks every Friday filled with non-perishable food items for their families experiencing food shortages. For the last eight years, our Unit has provided all the fixins for a traditional Thanksgiving dinner—from candied yams and mashed potatoes, to canned veggies, stuffing, gravy, and cranberry sauce. We also provide mini-marshmallows, pumpkin pie filling, and a graham cracker crust. This year, we shopped for ten Eastbrook families. We also shopped for our Veterans holiday food

baskets that we deliver to the Lake Baldwin VA to be distributed to their Giving Tree families for Christmas. Like the Eastbrook project, we have been providing holiday food baskets for at least ten years. These baskets include some additional items like dry cereal, peanut butter, jelly, flour, and sugar, in addition to the staples included in the Eastbrook backpacks.



On November 8th, Nell and Marge celebrated Veterans Day at Eastbrook by attending their Veterans breakfast and program that honored the Veteran families at the school. Marge and Nell manned our traditional Membership recruiting table where we provided information about the Legion Family to all the



Veteran families attending the breakfast. We also presented each Veteran with a small United States flag and a Poppy. Our Post Adjutant, Bob, also helped by talking with each Veteran about the Legion Family. After the program, we delivered the Backpack Project food to the Food Bank coordinator.

In December, we're looking forward to our Legion Family holiday party and we will begin sending out information about the Americanism Essay Contest and Girls State to our schools.

handmade pillows, several decks of cards, 120 soap sacks crocheted by our members and as prizes for bingo, 2 wheelchair blankets and one Afghan for the three winners. It was a very rewarding event for all of us and we are also going to try to go again in February. On veteran's day our event was with the Post; they had a flag ceremony outside and a small luncheon inside. The post honored seven of our veterans here in the community that had served in World War II and others from the Korean and Vietnam era. Our fundraising at the card party raised \$1995 for our unit to be able to support many of the other charities.

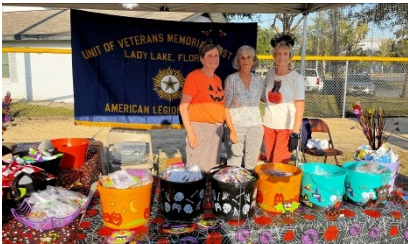

These bags went to six facilities: Watercrest in Buena Vista, Watercrest in Spanish Springs, Freedom Point Assisted Living, Chatham Glen Health and Rehabilitation, The Carriage House, and the Willows. Bags were created for men, women and memory care Veterans.



On Veteran’s Day, there was a Veteran Day Luncheon with a ceremonial Honor Guard and those in attendance were shown an outstanding PowerPoint presentation that included 96 veterans. Each slide had a photo of the Veteran during their time of service and one as they are now. The slide also included the branch in which they served, the years in service, their standing, and if the Veteran had



passed, it was acknowledged as In Loving Memory. Tina Charney Burgess did an outstanding job in putting this all together and they are looking to get it up on the website for others to see who may not have been able to attend the Veteran’s Day festivities.



Poppy distribution also was in full swing on November 11 with Auxiliary members out at ten locations in The Villages where they raised \$6517. So, between the spring and Veterans Day distribution, the ALA Unit 347 has raised a total of \$12,687 in donations and distributed 9,222 Poppies in two days!

Highlights from Fall Conference

If you were not able to attend the Department's Fall Conference this month, you missed an amazing program where not only did we have the opportunity to meet our National President, Trish Ward, and hear her present a new program, we also saw our Department Program Chairs present learning experiences about their programs.



Saturday morning kicked off with sessions about Membership with Jan Farrington and two special guests, President, Charlotte and National President, Trish. Jan emphasized the need for Units to have DD214's for their members as this is a National requirement. We also learned about other methods of verifying a prospective members eligibility for membership.

Past President's Parley with Wanda Brant, taught us how to mentor our members and Tammy Zell's session about National Security shared information about outside organizations that also focus on military service members and their families.

Robin Burk's class on Public Speaking had a special guest when Past Department President, Jane Hardacre, introduced National President, Trish. Dawn's "Early Light" Davis gave an enlightening presentation about the Americanism Essay contest and how to promote the Americanism program. Stacy Cusano helped us learn about scholarships and how to qualify along with how to assist our children, support teachers, and our schools as part of her Education class.

The Community Service class led by Robin Waltrous helped us see the connections between other organizations and our programs. Eileen Wilson's Girls State class talked about making school contacts, as well as the registration and interviewing process.

In the Children and Youth class with Lisa Hoyland, we learned about the Good Deed and Youth Hero awards and how to apply for them.

The morning also saw Linda Knoblach-Harkness lead a class on Veteran Affairs and Rehabilitation where we learned about hospital representatives and deputy reps and how we can support our Veterans in the hospitals.

Another morning class dealt with the Auxiliary Emergency Fund with Kathy Hemley who taught us about the application process and eligibility as well as fundraising ideas. Karen Marks gave an inspiring class about the Chaplain's duties of comforting and encouraging our members. And our very own, Dara Oliver led the Historian's class on preserving our history and writing a narrative.

Sherry Shupp and Andrea Sherman led training for Unit Sergeant-at-Arms and Nana Lontakos talked about risk and compliance issues, including addressing questions about the new BOI report being required by the IRS.

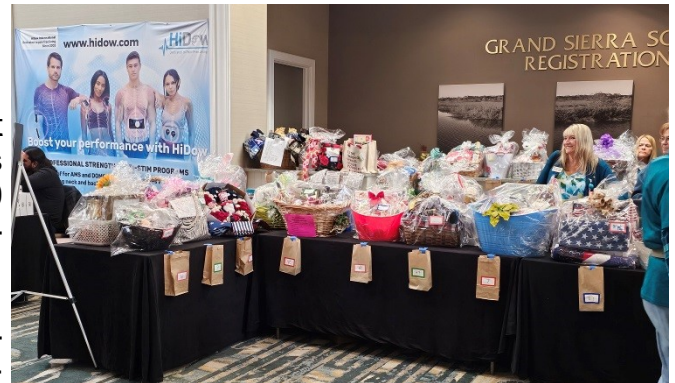
