Can you believe it is almost time for our year end reports? Don't wait until the last minute start making your outlines now and just fill in the blanks. If you have already completed things like Poppies or submissions for the Americanism Essay contest, you can go ahead and knock those reports out now. Remember, you do not have to do this alone. Several units will hold pizza parties where they can compare notes on what each member and the unit have accomplished for the year. The most important thing to remember is to have each member of your unit complete the MEMBER Impact form and get back to your UNIT President. The UNIT president will then send that into the DIS-TRICT president who then in turn sends her numbers to the DEPARTMENT President who turns that into NATIONAL. These numbers are directly reported to Congress so that our lobbyists can work towards better funding for our veterans. Without these numbers, they do not see all of the hard work that has been done.

The form can be located at : <u>alafl.org</u> > Forms and Resources > Unit Forms > Impact Forms Member.

The front pages give some great suggestions on how or where to count your hours. Do you cook meals at your home post all the time? Those hours can be counted towards serving your ALA in your community .. remember even if you are working the mission outside of a sponsored Unit function, those hours still count! At the March District Meeting we will be discussing reporting and the impact form even more.

Aside from the Impact form your unit chairman need to submit reports for the programs that were worked throughout the year. Before you sit down to write the report, be sure to check out the Program Engagement Plans and also the Year end report forms so you know what questions you will need to include in your report. You do not HAVE to write a narrative unless you are applying for an award, a few bulliet points discussing how you worked the prorgam and that counts towards a report!

I have been asked a few times how to apply for National Awards, the criteria and instructions can be located at <u>https://member.legion-aux.org/member/award-for-excellence</u>. Remember pictures are worth 1000 words so submitting photos helps tell your story.

While not all Units work 100% of our programs, if there is one that your unit does not do, instead of not submitting a report, simply fill out the required form and state that your unit did not have any activity in the program this year. Guess, what? You just got a 100% reporting on that program!

While we are discussing leadership, there are some great new classes that are available online at the ALA Academy. These include : Celebrating Women of Service, Insurance Information for Girls State programs, How to apply for an AEF Grant, Tax Exemption Status and so much more. All of this is free! Just enter your member number online and go to the ALA Academy Section.

Finally, remember it's okay to brag on yourself and your unit for the hard work you do to service our Veterans and Community !


