
Our next big thing was the post family angel tree and Christmas food basket project. There were nine families with a total of 28 children between them. One of the families had two adopted children that were



James Earl Carter Jr., widely known as Jimmy Carter, was born on October 1, 1924, in Plains, Georgia. He grew up on a peanut farm, the son of Earl and Lillian Carter. His humble beginnings shaped his strong work ethic and commitment to public service.

Carter attended the United States Naval Academy, graduating in 1946. He served in the U.S. Navy under Admiral Hyman Rickover, where he worked on nuclear submarines, a career that prepared him for leadership and problem-solving at a national level.

In 1953, Carter left the Navy to return to Georgia, where he took over his family's peanut farm after his father's death. He later expanded his business operations and became a successful businessman. During this time, Carter became increasingly involved in local politics, eventually running for the Georgia State

Senate in 1962. His political career progressed, and by 1970, he was elected Governor of Georgia. As governor, Carter earned a reputation for his progressive stances on racial integration, education reform, and fiscal responsibility. He was an advocate for environmental protection and improved race relations in a deeply segregated South.

Carter's political ascent culminated in his successful campaign for the presidency in 1976. Carter has been involved in projects such as monitoring elections in developing countries and building homes for Habitat for Humanity.

Throughout his life, Carter has remained committed to peace, justice, and service, earning a lasting legacy as a tireless advocate for human rights and a beacon of humility and moral integrity in American politics.
