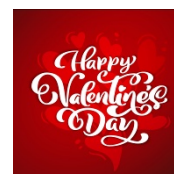

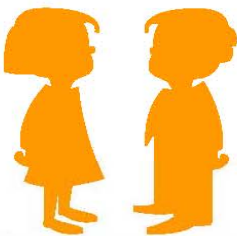
February is Americanism month. Time to freshen up on flag etiquette.
