Constitution & ByLaws



IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING YOUR GOVERNING DOCUMENTS

It was announced last month that National has made a change to their Standing Rules. A change to Rule XI, Section 6, was made at a recent NEC meeting that allows Unit officers or the Post Adjutant or other Post Officers to certify the membership eligibility of applicants for Auxiliary Unit membership.

"Membership may be established by certification from the Post Adjutant or other Post Officer or from the Unit Secretary or other Unit Officer. Eligibility through the service of a living veteran may be established by presentation of a current The American Legion card. Membership eligibility through the service of a deceased veteran may be established by presentation of the deceased veteran's proof of military service. Joining online requires an affidavit of eligibility; the Unit may request a copy of the veteran's proof of military service.

The Unit Secretary or other Unit officer can now verify eligibility. When the veteran is alive, the veteran's Legion membership card is proof. When the veteran is deceased an honorable discharge record show eligibility as before. Units may also use the Veterans DD214 or their Military ID card. This change is in effect now.

All Units must now decide which Unit Officer (or Officers) can verify eligibility for Auxiliary membership by reviewing DD214's, military ID's, etc. and then incorporate that decision in their Standing Rules.

Also, at the July Department Workshop, Cheryl Yoder, our Department Constitution and ByLaws Chair, mentioned a new State of Florida law for non-profits (HB 797) that mandates that having a Code of Conduct and a Conflict-of-Interest statement included in your governing documents is now required. Cheryl will be posting more information on the Department website. Please review the new law and make sure your documents are complying. Units who do not comply with the new law could face having their non-profit status revoked by the state.
