The American Legion Auxiliary Education Program has an important mission: to promote quality education for children and adults, encourage schools to invite veterans into their classrooms, provide scholarship opportunities for students pursuing higher education, and support legislation that creates and strengthens educational opportunities.

One of the best ways we can make a greater impact is by **working together across our programs**. So many of our American Legion Auxiliary programs go hand in hand, and collaboration gives us an opportunity to accomplish even more in our communities.

For example, **Education and Americanism** can work together by visiting schools to teach students about proper flag etiquette while also encouraging them to participate in the **Americanism Essay Contest**.
